- It is also home to the Danube Swabian Central Museum (DZM) . The permanent exhibition and special exhibitions depict the culture and everyday life of this German minority in the multi-ethnic settlement areas along the middle reaches of the Danube in the Pannonian Plain.

Wekerledorf (Gajdobra)

A forgotten German village in South Batschka By Nikola Milivojević

Information about the village of Nova Gajdobra is quite scarce. The village of *Kereky* is mentioned in Hungarian sources in the immediate vicinity of the village in 1327. The settlement is mentioned again in the Hungarian census from 1512. It was inhabited mainly by South Slavs and Hungarians. *Kereky* was consisted of a collection of dugouts and a semi-dungeon. Further mentions of the village can be found in Ottoman censuses from 1554, 1570 and 1590. It is precisely on the basis of these sources that we learn that the number of inhabitants of the settlement varied over time from 12 to 4, and then to 17 homes. In addition, from them we also learn that the settlement had several houses instead of dugouts and was inhabited exclusively by Serbs. The last mention of *Kereky* was recorded in the census from 1650.

Today's settlement was formed in 1885. It was founded by the Hungarian royal treasury on part of the attar of the village of *Schönau* (Gajdobra), i.e. in the *Metković* and *Kereky* wastelands.

The village of *Wekerledorf*, or *Wekerlefalva* in Hungarian, was named in 1894 in honor of the Hungarian Minister of Finance *Sándor Wekerle* (In office: 17 November 1892 – 14 January 1895). *Sándor Wekerle* (14 November 1848 – 26 August 1921) was a Hungarian politician of Donauschwaben origin.

According to the census from 1900, the settlement had 1,114 inhabitants and 217 houses. The majority of the population consisted of ethnic Germans, 1074, followed by Hungarians, 25 inhabitants, Serbs, 5, and others. In the period from its establishment until the Second World War, the village belonged to the *Palanka District*. It functioned as an independent municipality.

From 1918 to 1941, together with the rest of Batschka, it was part of the Kingdom of Serbs, Croats and Slovenes, and


later, from 1929, Yugoslavia. During the Second World War, from April 1941 to October 1944, *Wekerledorf* was under the administration of the Kingdom of Hungary. The German population fled the village from the summer of 1944 to December 1944 in advance of the Russian and Partisan troops. Those that remained suffered in concentration camps.

After the war, it was renamed Nova Gajdobra and settled by colonists from Bosnia and Herzegovina under Tito's Partisan government. **

A little Riesling history. The ancient Romans loved to drink, and after discovering viticulture, courtesy of the Greeks and Etruscans, wine was the drink of choice at the heart of Rome's culture.

And during their conquests of Germanic territories, some 2,000 years ago, they introduced viticulture... wine made from grapes wasn't known to the Teutons who drank mead, now many of Germany's best vine-yards are located on what were Roman sites. With the country's first wine cellar, built in Trier around 330 AD, still in use today.

They even dedicated a God to wine and a good time, Bacchus, and the beautiful small town of Bacharach took its name, so legend goes, from the Celtic word "Baccaracum" - Baccarus' farm. Or from the Latin word "Bacchiara" - the altar of Bacchus.

As conquerors, Romans brought the first vines to the Moselle Valley, together with the knowledge of how to cultivate them, and by the 1850's Riesling was commanding higher prices than Bordeaux and Champagne.




TRENTON DONAUSCHWABEN CLUB COOKBOOK IS SOLD OUT
